

## Projects Available for 2025 Cohort

### Health Education

- Runway Toxic Economy curriculum
  - This curriculum was developed by the [Cancer Free Economy Network](#) in partnership with Latinas Contra Cancer. The curriculum is complete, both in English and Spanish, and include a Facilitator's Guide. The curriculum describes a multi-day group workshop/training with various activity that aim to teach about the toxic substances that we encounter in our homes, our communities, and our workplaces, who is responsible for their persistence, and how they are related to cancer development. The fellows' responsibilities will be:
    - Establish relationships with organizations/audiences where we can deliver the trainings
    - Deliver 3 trainings (one in the spring, summer, and fall of 2024)
      - The fellows will determine the best methods for delivery, if remote or in-person. Thus, some in-person availability for delivery of workshops is necessary
      - Take lead in the improvement and success of the curriculum. This might include figure out what methods, materials, etc works best when delivering the training, maximizing training methods, etc
    - Report to coordinator of the Fellowship
- You can choose to help the Coordinator of Health Education improve health education materials.

**Community Organizing** – LCC has a community committee that is committed to advocating for the needs of the Latinx community in San Jose. The committee is filled with community members and led by our Patient Community Organizers

- Fellows should attend committee meetings and help organize the community
  - Meet with medical & political leadership to fulfill committee agenda
  - Help with trainings for committee participants
  - Collaborate and report to Patient Community Organizers
  - Develop and implement Patient Bill of Rights in the county by fall 2024
- As part of our services with **Defensoras** and **Health Education**, fellows will develop a curriculum for the children of the Defensoras participants and committee attendees who bring children to in-person sessions, reflecting topics of empowerment and health education
- Fellows will research how community organizing impacts health outcomes and implement methods to answer this research question.
